The name of JAMES HENRY BAXTER should be added to the names of Civil War Veterans interred at Union Cemetery. He was born August 2, 1844 or 1845 in Maryland. He enlisted in the local militia at York Furnace, Pennsylvannia, June 30, 1863, and was mustered into the Service of the U.S. on July 2, 1863. He was injured by a sabre wound in the neck at the Battle of Gettysburg. He had resided six years in Redwood City prior to his death on September 2, 1936.
